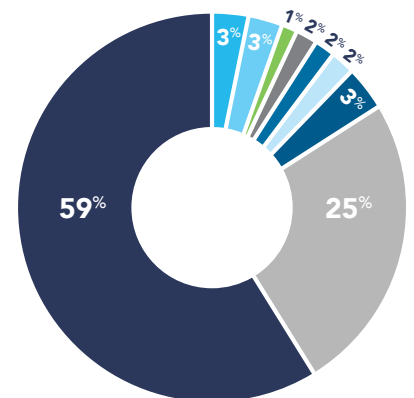
SET TARGETS FOR WASTE REDUCTION:
